

Operation Instructions

Read and follow all instructions carefully before operating your solar light. Save this leaflet for future reference.

HOW THE SOLAR POWERED LIGHT WORKS

During the day, the solar panel converts sunlight into electricity and recharges the battery. At night, the light turns on automatically using the electricity stored during that day.

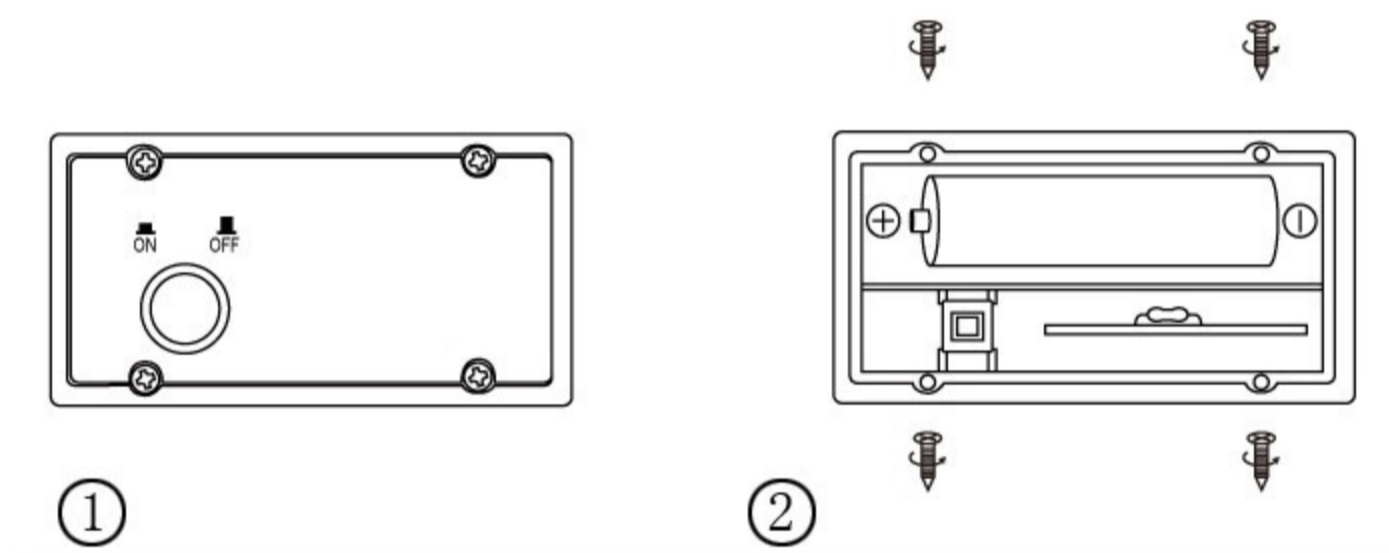
INSTALLATION AND OPERATION

Select a location with full, direct sunlight that is free from shade. The selected location should not be near another light source. This might keep the solar light from automatically turning on. Charge in direct sunlight for 8 hours. The item will turn on automatically at night. Turn switch “OFF” to deactivate the light.

CHANGING BATTERY

If the lights stop working after a period of use, the internal battery may need to be replaced.

1. Press the button to “OFF” position.
2. Unscrew the battery compartment lid with Phillips head screwdriver (not included).
3. Remove battery. Replace with new AAA Ni-MH rechargeable battery according to the polarity symbols indicated in the battery compartment.
4. Replace battery compartment lid.

TROUBLESHOOTING

If your solar light does not turn on at night, it may be caused by one of the following:

1. Make sure the button is set to the “ON” position.
2. Make sure your light is located in an area where the solar panel gets direct sunlight and is free from shade. A shady location will not allow the battery to fully charge and will reduce the hours of night time light.
3. If your light is located too close to other light source, it may not turn on automatically at night. Eliminate the other light source or relocate your solar light.
4. Old batteries may wear out and not accept charge. Check and replace the battery as required.
5. Sometimes the battery comes loose and no contact is being made. Make sure the battery is firmly contacting the terminal at each end of the battery holder.
6. A dirty solar panel will not allow the battery to fully charge. Clean regularly with a dampened cloth or paper towel.
